Ebrary– Lots more books to read and discover

How to access Ebrary

1. Go to our library home page at <http://www.ldsbc.edu>
2. You will find the link in the far left hand corner underneath the title–

Book Resources

3. In the left hand column you will see a search box with a few choices.

Search, Advanced and Browse

4. Search

Simple– you can enter in any term you want. For example: accounting. However, this will give you thousands of results, so it is better to narrow it down. For example: accounts receivable, but even then you will get more results than you probably want so this kind of search is best if you already have a specific title in mind which you are trying to find.

Advanced search– allows you to enter in more than one keyword, subject, author, title or publisher and to also search within the text rather than just within the title.

The advanced search option also allows you to search via language or document type - books, journals, maps, reports and sheet music.

Browse– allows you to look through books by subject matter just as you would if browsing on a physical library shelf.

5. View

This is the feature you use to look at a book within ebrary. You can look at the books and read them online, print out a few pages, or save them for later.

6 Bookshelf

This is the save online feature. You can create an account and save books you have found within the ebrary system to your account for retrieval later on.

7. The sheet music option allows you to browse or search for sheet music of all different genres. You can actually view the music online.

There is also a help feature which you can use to ask questions and get help if you need it.
