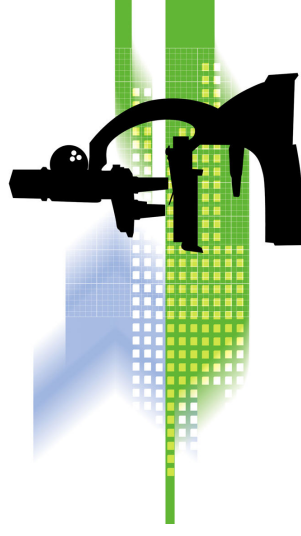
This is one of our newer books in the medical collection and contains practical advice on how to master anatomy and physiology and live to tell about the experience.

## Databases

[MedLine MEDLINE](#) is produced by the National Library of Medicine; the original version is called PUBMED. References are added from over 4700 medical journals and publications and it includes the years 1966 to present. MEDLINE references are obtained from peer reviewed journals, and covers subjects in medicine, nursing, dentistry, veterinary medicine, the health care services, and clinical and pre-clinical medical sciences.

[National Guideline Clearinghouse](#) The NGC is an Internet-based comprehensive database of evidence-based clinical practice guidelines and related materials that have been submitted by 167 health care organizations, associations, medical societies and Federal agencies. Updated weekly, the site is currently used by physicians, nurses, medical/nursing students, and other health care providers in the field.
